# **Gosport, Fareham and Solent Football League**

Formed 2013

#### The League

#### **Brief Summary**

Gosport, Fareham and Solent Football League, formed 2013, Affiliated to the Hampshire Football Association Limited and a member of the Portsmouth Divisional Football Association.

This season the Gosport, Fareham and Solent League has 26 Clubs / 31 Teams divided into three divisions, ten teams in Division One and Division Two and eleven teams in Division Three.

#### Location

Based in Gosport, Hampshire, England with Clubs accepted within a 10 mile radius.

#### **Brief History of the League**

The League was formed in 2013 from an amalgamation of the Gosport and Fareham League and the Solent Football League.

#### **Brief History of Gosport and Fareham League**

In 1904 The Gosport District League was formed and later became known as the Gosport and Fareham League.

#### **Brief History of Solent Football League**

The League called the Solent Premier League and was not affiliated to any associations, was formed in 1987 from Clubs of the Friendly League that started in 1971.

In 1995 the League applied for affiliation to the Hampshire Football Association who asked the Portsmouth Football Association to vet our application. It was suggested by the PFA that the League become the Solent Divisions of the Gosport and Fareham League.

In the 1995/6 season the Solent Premier League became the Solent Divisions of the G & F League. After two seasons the Solent Divisions decided to once again apply for affiliation, as the Solent Football League, to the HFA.

The application was successful and led, in the 1997/8 season, to the League's membership of the PFA now called the Portsmouth Divisional Football Association (PDFA).

## John Norton Memorial Cup

## John Norton - 1937-2016

One of my fondest memories of my Dad won't be a surprise for those of you who knew him, yes it was Football. Dad used to come home from work on a Saturday, grab his football bag, a flask of Beef Oxo and a bag of oranges for half time. We used to stand at the side of the pitch whilst Dad ran the line, his full focus on the match. But it used to be his half time chats with the team that I remember the most. Looking back now I can see the passion, the commitment and the love of the game. I admire him for that. You could never go anywhere without someone knowing Dad, I even used to be given result cards at school to bring home! Even Dad's hands bore the scars of football; as a young child I used to think that his fingers were pregnant as his knuckles were twice the size from being a goalie.

His lifelong passion for the game started at a young age, leading to him playing for Victory Sports FC, which was formed in 1952. He started playing in goal around 1957, he continued playing even taking over as Club Secretary in early 60's.

John's enthusiasm for football soon led to him being involved in, what was then the, Gosport & Fareham Football League becoming the Results Secretary in 1968. Even then John continued to be involved in the teams by playing and running Wanderers, Lambs and then Lee Athletic. He went on to be the President of the league in 2006, even receiving a 50yr service member in 2007 from the FA, one of his proudest moments.

I will always remember the muddy football strips in the bath, the social events, and the camaraderie. His enthusiasm for the game, the league and the friends he met along the way made my Dad. To him football was not just a game, it was a passion, it was in his blood and in his heart. Playing football with your feet is one thing, but to play it with your heart is another. To quote Pele "Success is no accident, it is hard work, perseverance, learning, studying, sacrifice and most of all, love of what you are doing" and my Dad certainly did all of that and more.

The cup being played for today started out as a trophy for a friendly between Victory Sports and Ludgershall (near Andover) and was called the Victory Cup. Starting around 1957 the cup became an annual social outing until around 1979. Despite Victory Sports FC folding in the mid 60's the cup continued to be played for under the title of the Victory Cup for clubs associated with John. So it is poignant that this cup, so personal to John, is being played for in his memory.
